Only two in ten (19%) of you intend to do any campaigning in the build up to election day.











Two-thirds (67%) of you either don't read political manifestos, or don't know what they are.

Only a quarter (26%) of you know how many seats are in the House of Commons (there are 650).





Less than one in twelve (8%) of you have considered standing as a candidate in a UK General Election. Interestingly, three times more men (13%) than women (4%), had considered it.


Bring the dog! One fifth of you (22%) correctly realise that dogs are allowed in polling stations, so long as they're well-behaved!
